3-5:00 pm	Arrival at Louis Armstrong New Orleans Airport	Located across from the baggage area. One way to your hotel \$20.00. Reservations: (504) 522-3500
5:30-6:00 pm	Check-in Lafitte's Guest House 1003 Bourbon Street	Pick up a free map of the French Quarter at the desk
6:30-7:30	Lafitte's Blacksmith Shop 941 Bourbon Street	Walk across the street to Lafitte's Blacksmith Shop for a drink and to mix with the locals.
7:00-8:00	Jackson Square 615 Pere Antoine Alley	People watch and listen to impromptu music as you walk around the square and soak in the flavor of New Orleans.
8:00- 9:30	Dinner Irene's Cuisine 539 Saint Philip Street	A short two block stroll from the Square is a traditional New Orleans cuisine restaurant, Irene's.
9:30- ??	Fritzel's European Jazz Pub 733 Bourbon Street	Some of the best jazz in the Quarter. This is where the musicians come when they finish their gigs.

1:15-3:00	New Orleans Cemetery History Tour Rev. Zombie's Voodoo Shop	Go on a guided walking tour of one of the many above ground cemeteries.
